

COVID POLICY UPDATE — JANUARY 10TH 2022

Covid Positive Staff or Student	Household Exposure	Classroom Exposure	Carpool or Social Exposure
<p>A Covid positive student or staff member must stay home for 5 days from symptom onset or the date the positive test was administered.</p> <p>They may return to school Day #6 if there are no symptoms.</p>	<p>If the Covid positive person isolates, household members can return to school on Day #6 with a negative test from the first day of isolation from Covid positive person.</p> <p>If the Covid positive person does not isolate, household members will return after a negative test on Day #10 from when the Covid positive person started symptoms or tested positive.</p>	<p>If there is a positive Covid case in a classroom, Covid positive person stays home - see previous categories.</p> <p>The class members “Test to Stay” for up to five days. SHA will administer rapid antigen tests – parents remain in parking lot until results are known.</p> <p>No classroom quarantine.</p>	<p>Exposed child(ren) or staff test, rapid or PCR, may return with a negative result.</p> <p>Then test again on Day #5 past exposure, rapid or PCR.</p> <p>This may change depending on situation.</p> <p>Please let us know if you had an exposure.</p>

SHA TRAVEL POLICY FOR STUDENTS & STAFF

Step 1:

Upon return from travel out-of-state, students and staff, should test on the day of return at home, if the test is negative, and student / staff are symptom free, they may return to school the next day.

Step 2:

Test again on day #5, if it is a school day – school will test at drop off.

Continue to monitor for symptoms of all household members.
